

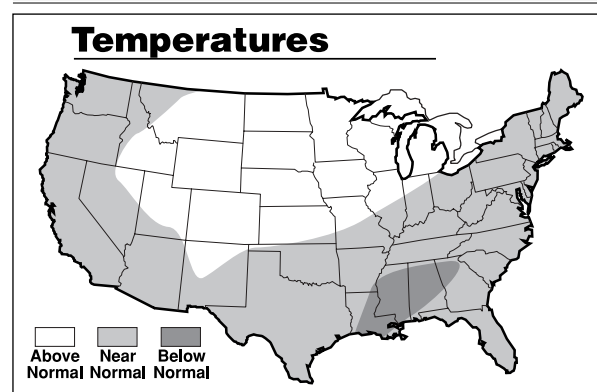

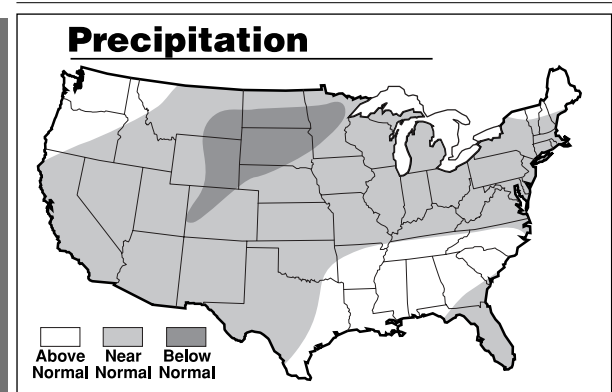

Rescuers tried to help but they were too late. A Labor Day trip down the Schuylkill River turned tragic when the canoe carrying Vidya Anand, 29, and her three-year-old daughter Tara, overturned. Both drowned. The father, Krishnan was also in the boat. The family was from Lower Merion Township.

The portion of the river, near Birdsboro, can have dangerous currents and canoeists have little warning of possible dangerous areas. A mother and daughter died here when their canoe overturned. Rescuers pulled the infant out, but she was pronounced dead on arrival at the hospital.
