Additional acres saved in Berks County

An additional 600 acres of Berks County farmland will be preserved through the purchase of conservation easements valued at more than \$1.2 million.

The purchase money has been approved by the the state Agriculture Land Preservation

Board, according to state Senator Mike O'Pake, a board member.

Berks County has 188 farms making up about 22,765 acres that have already been preserved. The county has the second highest number of farms preserved in the state.

Statewide, 1,695 farms, or 204,986 acres have been preserved since the program's inception.
