# Mako Sharks swim to county title

Members of the Mako Sharks swam away with the county championship this past summer.

Ryan Berger swam in the mens' 13-14 year-old division and placed first in the 200m (2:12.46) freestyle and fourth in the 100m freestyle (1:02.61).

Emily Christy, who swam in the 13-14 year-old womens' division captured three firsts in the 100m butterfly (1:07.07), the 200m freestyle (2:11.94) and the 400m freestyle (4:34.42).

Ryan Colby notched a first place in the mens' 11-12 year-old 100m freestyle (1:06.07).

Frank Zelinger, also swam in the 11-12 mens' category took a first in the 200m IM (2:48.28), a third in the 200m freestyle (2:32.54) and third in the 50m butterfly (34.88).

Kacey Centrella swimming in the 15-18 womens' division placed second in the 400m freestyle (4:43.18). She also placed fifth in the 200m IM and sixth in the 100m butterfly. Kyle Centrella, swimming in the mens' 15-18 division notched a fourth in the 100m butterfly (1:04.56).

Jenny Brizek took a fourth in the 100m breaststroke (1:23.13) as a 13-14 womens' division swimmer. She also placed fifth in both the 100m backstroke and 200m IM. Alex Allen, swimming in the same division captured a fourth in the 100m freestyle (1:04.74).

In the 15-18 mens' division, Pat Collins swam to a fourth place in the 100m backstroke (1:04.69).

Billy Draves placed third in the Under 8 division 25m butterfly (19.92) and fourth in the 25m backstroke (23.94). Shannon Draves placed third in the 100m freestyle (1:17.86) as a 9-10 womens' competitor.

Jen Fenstra placed fourth in the 15-18 womens' division 100m butterfly (1:08.72), the 50m freestyle (28.37) and the 100m freestyle (1:03.39).

Caitlin Fisher had a fourth in the womens' 13-14 division 400m freestyle (4:55.68) and two sixth place finishes in the 200m and 100m freestyle.

Alex Fox's 1:09.32 was good for a fourth place in the 100m butterfly. He also finished fifth in the mens' 13-14 division 200m IM. Alec Francis swam in the mens' 9-10 division and placed second in the 50m freestyle (40.57) and third in the 100m IM (1:31.29).

Ryne Francis, swimming in the mens' 13-14 division captured a second in the 400m freestyle (4:53.71) and third in the 200m freestyle (2:17.73).

Michael Ingram, a 13-14 mens' division competitor garnered two seconds in the 200m freestyle (2:15.27) and the 100m backstroke (1:09.51).

Ashley Kroh finished third in the 200m freestyle and fourth in the 400m freestyle (4:45.28). She also placed fifth in the 100m breaststroke. Kroh competed in the womens' 15-18 division.

Peter Lanning, also a 15-18 competitor, notched a third in the mens' 50m freestyle (25.70).

Shayna Longacre, in the 13-14 womens' division, placed second in the 100m breaststroke (1:18.77), third in the 200m IM (2:33.71) and sixth in the 100m backstroke. Tamar Maloney competed in the same age category and took two seconds with a 28.30 in the 50m freestyle and a 2:16.28 in the 200m freestyle.

Leslie Moatz, swimming in the womens' 15-18 division, captured a second in the 100m breaststroke (1:17.61), a fourth in the 200m IM (2:36.90) and a fifth in the 50m freestyle.

Kerry Nichols, a 13-14

womens' competitor, placed second in the 100m butterfly (1:07.65), fourth in the 200m IM (2:35.40) and fifth in the 100m breaststroke.

Alex Niconovich took fourth place in the mens' 15-18 division 100m breaststroke (1:15.00).

Sarah Rayco placed fourth in the womens' 13-14 division 100m freestyle (1:07.85).

Briahna Renninger was the womens' 11-12 division sixth place finisher in the 50m backstroke. Alyssa Romasco, swimming in the same division, finished third in the 200m freestyle (2:35.71) and fifth in the 50m butterfly (35.64).

Tim Robinson, a 15-18 mens' division swimmer, finished fourth in the 50m freestyle (25.73). Kristen Roncase, a womens' 15-18 competitor for the Mako Sharks placed third in the 100m freestyle (1:06.14) and fourth in the 100m backstroke (1:12.19).

Kevin Simmons, an 11-12 mens' swimmer took a sixth place in the 100m freestyle. Peter Starr, a mens' 15-18 division swimmer took two sixth places in the 50m freestyle and the 100m backstroke. Ben Trout, an 11-12 division competitor, finished sixth in the 200m freestyle.

Ryan Umberger secured two fifth place finishes in the mens' 9-10 division. Umberger swam the 50m freestyle (34.78) and 100m IM (1:35.95).

Ryan Wright, swimming in the mens' 13-14 division placed second in the 100m butterfly (1:05.56), fourth in the 200m IM (2:35.41).

Brandon Youse, a mens' 15-18 swimmer, took second in the 100m backstroke (1:03.44), third in the 200m freestyle (2:01.40) and third in the 200m IM (2:17.81).

The relay teams will be reported next week.
