Boyertown

Football

Boyertown dropped its second game of the season to Conrad Weiser, 13-7 on September 21. The Bears (1-1, 2-2) scored first in the first quarter to take a 7-0 lead on the one yard TD run by Marc Panepinto. Eric Reish provided the extra point with a kick splitting the uprights.

The Scouts (2-1, 3-1) answered with 10 points in the second period to take a 10-7 lead at halftime. They scored from the one and Mark Brubaker, who stars for the Scouts in soccer as a striker, booted the ball through the uprights for the PAT. He then used his soccer talents to kick a 17 yard field goal for three points and the Scouts lead.

In the third period, Brubaker's foot was put to use again. The Scout kicker, who spends about 15 minutes a week practicing his place kicking for football, launched a decisive 32 yard field goal to end the scoring.

Panepinto carried the ball 25 times for Boyertown, netting 125 yards. The Bears collected 143 yards on the ground and only 13 through the air as Reich went 4-for-14 with one interception.

Field Hockey

The Lady Bears (3-3-1, 3-3-1) posted two shutout wins last week, defeating Muhlenberg (3-3, 3-5) and Conrad Weiser (3-3-1, 4-3-2) by the identical 2-0 score.

Jill Fisher and Erica Erb tallied goals. Alicia Grater, the Bears' goalie turned away all seven of Muhlenberg's shots.

The JV game was won by Boyertown, 2-1.

The Scouts were hosts to the Bears and found them ungracious as the Boyertown unit got goals from Shannon Houck and Lindsey Nurk. Grater stopped five of the 10 Weiser shots.

The JV contest was rained out.

Cross Country

Boyertown's boys' and girls' cross country teams defeated Schuylkill Valley and Daniel Boone soundly in a tri-meet at SV.

The girls turned in a perfect 15-50 score over the Panthers and a near perfect 16-43 win over Boone. The boys were almost as impressive with a 20-37 defeat of Schuylkill Valley and a 17-43 win over the Blazers.

Over the 3.1 mile course, Becca Kehs led the Lady Bears with a 21:50 followed by Izzy Valenti (21:57), Steph Skovronski (22:15), Kathy Malenckek (22:20) and Ashley Prestia (22:49).

Brandon Foose led the boys with a 17:36. Ten seconds behind Foose was Matt Renninger (17:46). Craig Geiser was the third Bear to finish with an 18:01. Brad Anderson and Jim Waddington rounded out the boys' scoring with 18:35 and 19:12 respectively.

At the Conrad Weiser Invitational, Geiser (19:01) led the boys to a seventh placed team finish in a field of 17.

Valenti (22:21) paced the girls, finishing 16th overall and first for Boyertown. The Lady Bears scored 135 team points for a fourth place finish.

Golf

The Boyertown golf team (6-2, 8-3) posted two home course wins last week with wins over Hamburg (5-2, 10-3) and Twin Valley (1-7, 2-11) at Twin Ponds.

Dustin Smale led the way against the Hawks with a 71. Kyler Kolarz shot a 72 and Mike Furman carded a 73. Jordan Grater and Keith Thomas each shot 74.

Kolarz and Smale registered 76s against Twin Valley. Thomas notched a 79 while Grater scored 80 and Mike Prutzman tallied an 81.

Soccer

Three was the magic number for Boyertown (5-1,8-1) as they scored three goals against Muhlenberg (2-4, 2-9-1) and Brandywine Heights (1-8-1) to post wins of 3-1 and 3-2 respectively.

In the win over the Muhls, Marc Benson scored twice and assisted on Mike Rakowski's

goal.

Chad Davis made two stops on the six shots taken by Muhlenberg. The Bears held a 19-6 edge in shots on goal.

Boyertown won the JV contest, 1-0.

Against the Bullets, Benson scored two more as the Bears leveled 34 shots at the goal.

Tennis

The Lady Bears tennis team (1-8) was shut out twice last week as Wilson (8-1) and Muhlenberg (7-2) registered 7-0 wins over Boyertown.

Cross Country

Oley Valley's boys' cross country team was defeated by Reading, 20-35, in a tri-meet at Kutztown. The Lynx lads defeated the Cougars, 26-29. David Morgan crossed the finish line first for the Lynx. Devin Kelly and Luke Butchko second and third finishers for Oley Valley. Alex Lambi and Matt Kirn rounded out the Lynx scoring.

The Lady Lynx dropped both contests, losing to Reading, 24-37, and 23-38 to Kutztown. Tamsin Gonsalves led the Oley Valley squad with a time of 22:53 over the 3.1 mile course.

Field Hockey

Assists were registered by Houck (2) and Fry. Evans and Leann Duprey shared the goal-keeping duties and only had to stop one.

The JV fray was won by Oley, 10-0.

At the Conrad Weiser Soccer tournament, Oley lost in the opening round to Weiser, 1-0, in overtime. In second round play, the Lynx were defeated by Pine Grove, 3-2, which placed them in the consolation game with Owen J. Roberts, Roberts defeated Oley, 1-0.

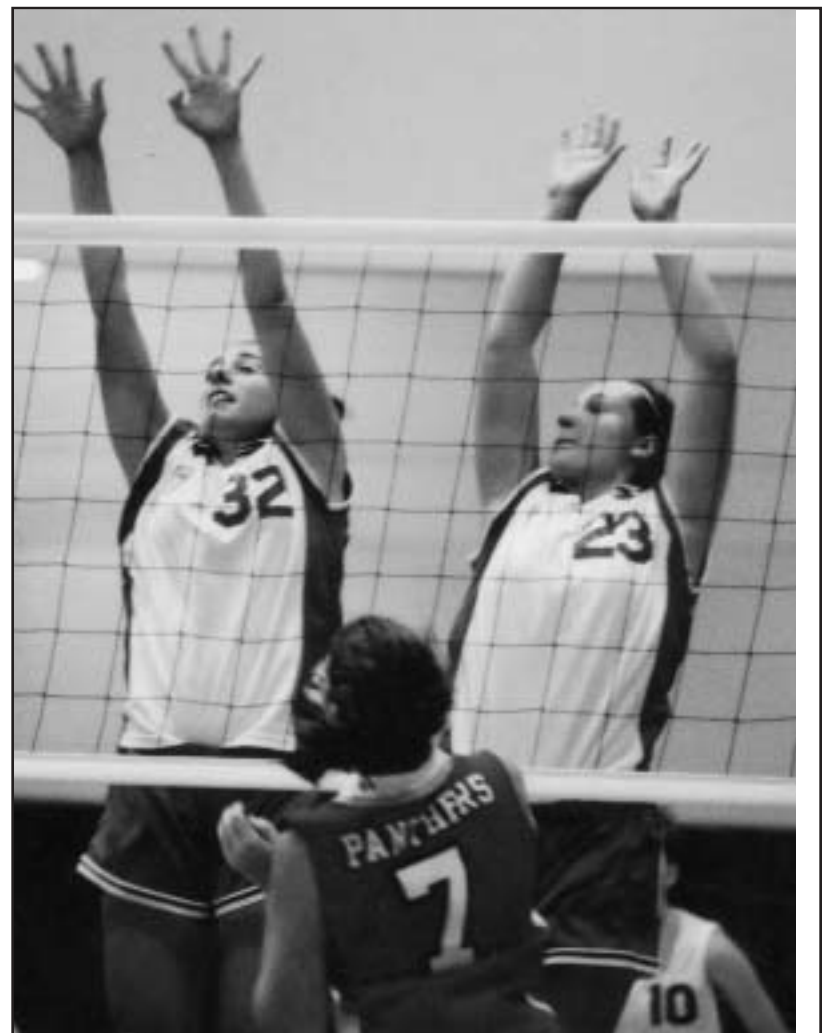
Volleyball
